A story is usually told from one standpoint. The standpoint the writer chooses determines the point of view. There are three basic points of view.

All-Knowing Omniscient: The narrator or storyteller knows what all the characters are thinking and doing.

First-Person: The narrator is a character in the story and uses *I* and *me* to refer to him or herself.

Third-Person: The narrator is outside the story but tells the story chiefly from the main character's point of view.

Because of Winn-Dixie is told from the first person point of view. Opal refers to herself as *I* in telling the story and acts as the narrator.
