Course Description:		
Are you searching for new and innovative ways to target reading instruction and interventions? If so, look no further because reading strategy groups are specifically designed to do just this. Strategy groups are a type of small group instruction which enable teachers to target specific reading skills that specific groups of students need, regardless of their independent reading level. This online course provides K-5 teachers with an arsenal of tools for addressing the reading needs of their students using small, focused, heterogeneous groups. The course begins by discussing the elements and benefits of reading strategy groups. Since strategy groups are based on assessment, the course delves into a variety of assessment types and approaches so that teachers can truly get to know their students as readers. Throughout the course, teachers learn how to use research-based best practices to choose strategies, books, and activities for before, during, and after reading. Teachers will learn specific reading strategies while working with English language learners and those who struggle with reading, as well as students who suffer the ill effects from trauma, poverty, and the pandemic. Teachers will learn how to build students' stamina and engagement as they work to become successful, independent readers. The different types of reading instruction are touched upon, and teachers will learn how to structure their mini-lessons so that students obtain the most "bang for their buck" during reading strategy groups. Teachers will learn the importance of relying on the science of reading as they work with their students across all areas of reading, specifically focusing on print work and fluency. By the end of this course, teachers will feel more confident and successful in their quest to embed best practices into their own small reading strategy groups.
