Course Timeline

Participants have one year to complete the course. Participants must spend a minimum of three weeks in this course.

Course Description

Do you have Google Classroom and want to fully understand how to maximize its potential? In this course, teachers will learn how to use all the features of Google Classroom to enhance their teaching. Strategies for using the announcement, question, and assignment options to enhance the learning process will be emphasized as teachers move toward a paperless classroom. Teachers will also learn how to effectively use all of the quiz options. Strategies for differentiating instruction using the features of Google Classroom will be explored. Specific instructions for integrating Google Classroom with other Google products such as Google Calendar and Google Docs, as well as, popular educational extensions and apps will be shared. Additionally, instructions for using the Google Classroom mobile app will be provided. Finally, using Google Classroom for assessment through the use of rubrics as well as the gradebook function are also shared. By the end of this course, teachers will confident using Google Classroom and all its tools and features.

- 4. Teachers will learn how to effectively navigate the Google Classroom dashboard.
- 5. Teachers will learn how to create classes and the options for inviting students to join.
- 6. Teachers will understand the purpose of the Google Classroom Stream and how to personalize it.
- 7. Teachers will learn how to use the Help features of Google Classroom.
- 8. Teachers will learn how to remove, e-mail, and mute a student.
- 9. Teachers will learn how to use the student post and comment controls.
- 10. Teachers will learn how to create and post a question.
- 11. Teachers will learn how to create and post an announcement.
- 12. Teachers will learn how to create and post an assignment.
- 13. Teachers will learn how to use and integrate the Google Calendar for all their classes.
- 14. Teachers will learn how to access and grade work.
- 15. Teachers will learn how to return graded work to students.
- 16. Teachers will learn how to export grades to a gradebook.
- 17. Teachers will learn how to use the features of Google Classroom to differentiate assignments.
- 18. Teachers will learn how to monitor and share student work.
- 19. Teachers will learn how to use the Google Classroom mobile app.
- 20. Teachers will learn who to assign grades using the Google Classroom mobile app.
- 21. Teachers will learn how to use extensions to enhance the Google Classroom experience.
- 22. Teachers will learn effective practices for ending one school and beginning a new one using the archive features.

- differentiate the assignment. Create an assignment that includes a due date and a topic. Attach all the resources and then take a screen shot.

Your submission should include the following. Please put all these items in a single document.

- ✓ A screen shot of a multiple choice question
- ✓ A screen shot of an announcement
- ✓ A screen shot of an assignment that shows a due date, topic, and at least three attached resources
- ✓ A minimum three-paragraph description of how the resources you post are each specifically used to differentiate the assignment
- ✓ Provide links to all three resources you chose from Edpuzzle, CK-12, and/or YouTube.
- ✓ Minimum two-paragraph App review

Assignment #5

The culminating practicum is a three-step process. (1) In the first assignment, you were asked what goals you had and what you hoped to learn from the course. Think back to your original goals for this course. Write a minimum two-paragraph reflection specifically describing how what you learned can be used to help you reach those goal(s). (2) Next, write a minimum three-paragraph plan that specifically describes the ways in which you intend to implement a particular strategy you learned in this course into your own teaching situation. (3) Last, write a minimum two-paragraph reflection describing a student you have or have had in the past. Then, discuss how the strategies you learned in this course will specifically benefit that student as you put your plan into action.
